Gisle Jakhelin's presentation will include illustrations of examples of his work and the vernacular architecture in northern Norway, and highlight the importance of involvement in ICOMOS and CIAV in particular.

Anna Meenan and Colm Murray will speak on the innovative grant scheme administered by the Heritage Council to support the maintenance and repair of traditional farm buildings on the basis of the contribution they make to the landscape. This scheme fosters the acquisition by the farmers themselves of the conservation skills to carry out the works. The rationale and administrative arrangements may be of interest to an international audience interested in policies for the care of vernacular buildings.
